Equality objectives statement

At Loughborough C of E Primary School we welcome our duties under the Equality Act 2010. The three aims of the Equality Duty are:

- To eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation
- To foster good relationships between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it
- To advance equality of opportunity between people who share a protected characteristic and people who do not share it

The protected characteristics covered by the Equality Duty are:

- Age.
- Race.
- Disability.
- Religion or belief including lack of belief.
- Gender.
- Sexual orientation.
- Gender reassignment.
- Marriage and civil partnership.
- Pregnancy or maternity.

The governing body will ensure that we do not discriminate against, harass or victimise any pupil, prospective pupil, parent, employee or other member of the school community because of their characteristics.

1. Eliminating unlawful discrimination

Loughborough C of E Primary School sets high expectations of children's achievements, and strives to ensure that all our pupils know they are valued and that they aspire to be the very best that they can be in the future. - Justice 'Learn to do right. Seek justice.' Isaiah 1:17

Our school is committed to not only eliminating discrimination, but also increasing understanding and appreciation for others. We are committed to having a balanced and fair

curriculum. We believe that our pupils should be exposed to ideas and concepts that may challenge their understanding and knowledge of the world, to help ensure that pupils learn to become more accepting and inclusive of others. 2. Fostering good relationships

Loughborough C of E Primary School does not tolerate any form of bullying or racist incident. We intend the school to be a happy and enjoyable place to work, which will provide the opportunity for every child and adult to fulfil their potential in an attractive, well-resourced and stimulating environment.

3. Advancing equality of opportunity

Equality of opportunity and non-discrimination extends to the treatment of all members of the school community. Pupils are encouraged to be the best that they can be and are given equal access to the curriculum and school activities. Children with special needs are given additional support where required, including support for language and learning difficulties, to ensure all pupils can achieve to the best of their ability.

Loughborough C of E Primary School will ensure that no staff or governor appointments, staff redundancy or disciplinary procedures are the result of direct or indirect prejudice or discrimination.
