Your child should be able to complete most of the tasks themselves, thus improving their independent learning skills. However, your support will be welcome at all times. Year 4 COOL activity grid

Please complete the activities in **Red** and then try to complete at least three of three other activities:

<u>English</u> In English we are writing a diary this half term. Write your own daily diary (it doesn't have to be pages and pages for each entry) for this half term using the types of sentences we learn during your lessons.	<u>Reading</u> Children should read at least three times a week for 15-20 minutes. This doesn't always have to be the children's reading book from school. When reading with children concentrate on accuracy and checking their understanding of what they have read.	<u>Maths</u> Practice times tables up to 12 x 12 until they are fluent. Log in to Times Table Rockstars for at least 30 minutes per week.
<u>History- Tudors</u> One of our history topics this year is the Tudors but who came before them? Make a timeline of the kings and queens from 1066 up to and including the last Tudor monarch (king or queen).	<u>Seasonal changes</u> Create a piece of artwork (in any medium) to show the changing season from summer to autumn.	<u>School Values</u> This half-term's focus value is Forgiveness. Write a story which shows this value. Remember to use lots of descriptive language and your sentence types
<u>RE- What kind of world did Jesus want?</u> Jesus had an idea of the type of world that he wanted. As you grow up, what type of world do you want to live in. Present your ideas in a way of your choice.	<u>Geography- Rivers</u> With an adult, visit a river and look for all the different animals and vegetation you can see there. Either draw a picture of what you can see or create a poster to show the animals and plants you saw. Try to label them if you can.	<u>Maths – times tables</u> Make a maths game, with instructions on how to play, to help learn your times tables.

Remember to complete your work in your homework book. You can stick pictures in to show the work you have done.

In addition to your homework, you will also get spellings to learn for a spelling test at the end of each week. These spellings will be given out shortly.
