The following tasks will be invaluable in supporting your child's learning in school. Your child should be able to complete most of the tasks themselves, thus improving their independent learning skills. However, your support will be welcome at all times. All pupils are expected to complete the homework tasks as stated below. Homework books need to be handed on the last Monday before half term.

Year 3 COOL activity grid

Please complete the activities in **Red** and then try to complete at least three of three other activities:

<u>English</u> In English we are writing a narrative to entertain. The children are to write a description of a setting using interesting adjectives about: • What they can see • What they can hear • What they can feel	<u>Reading</u> Children should read at least three times a week for 15-20 minutes. This doesn't always have to be the children's reading book from school. When reading with children concentrate on accuracy and checking their understanding of what they have read.	<u>Maths</u> The children will choose and write any 3-digit number up to 1,000. They will identify the value of each digit within their number, explaining the value of the hundreds, tens and ones. The children will then explore how their number changes when they add or subtract: • 1 – one more and one less • 10 – ten more and ten less • 100 – one hundred more and one hundred less They should record each calculation and explain how the value of the digit's changes.
<u>Art: Line</u> Create a monster picture using only lines. You can use pencil, pen, felt tips, crayons or even collage (cut out paper lines). Try to include different style of lines for example, straight, wavy, zigzag.	<u>English- Adjective hunt:</u> Go around your house or garden and list 10 things using exciting/strong adjectives. Remember if you use 2 or more adjectives you need to add a comma after the first one.	<u>School Values</u> This half-term's focus value is Forgiveness. Write a short story about forgiveness.
<u>RE- 'What it is like for someone to follow God?'</u> Think about what it might look like for a Christian to follow God in their everyday life. Draw pictures to show how they might do this.	<u>Geography: 'Our Local Area'</u> Go for a walk around your local area with a grown up. See if you can find and record: • 3 different types of buildings • 2 physical features • 2 human features • One important landmark • One thing you like about your local area.	<u>Maths – times tables:</u> Practice writing your times tables. Time yourself and see if you can beat your time each time!

Remember to complete your work in your homework book. You can stick pictures in to show the work you have done. **Please ensure homework is back in before the end of this term.**

In addition to your homework, you will also get spellings to learn for a spelling test at the end of each week. These spellings will be given out shortly.
