(Carrying On Our Learning)

Please complete the activities in **Red** and then try to complete at least three of the other activities.

Read and spell the list of common exception words for year 2. After you can read and spell them use them in a range of silly sentences. Remember to use capital letters, finger spaces, neat handwriting, noun phrases, conjunctions and full stops.	Read a book you have never read before.  <u>Challenge:</u> Tell us about your favourite part and why it was your favourite. You can write about it or create a picture poster telling us about it.	Using dice or an app alternative, roll the dice twice to create a 2-digit number. E.g the first roll may be 4 (tens) and the second roll may be 7 (ones). Partition the numbers into 10s and 1s using part whole models or a place value chart. Complete at least 20 of these partitions.
<u>Valuing Difference</u> In PHSE our lessons are looking at how we can maintain relationships, including understanding our feelings, bullying and being a good friend. Create a poster for anti-bullying and how you can be a good friend. E.g the do's - be kind to everyone, be inclusive. The don'ts - say mean things, hurt people,	<u>Science - Habitats</u> Draw an animal's habitat of your choice, adding a descriptive diagram of their simple food chains. E.g a frogs habitat would be a pond and the food chain would consist of plants, to a snail, to the frog and finally to a heron.	<u>Art</u> We will be looking at how to create a self portrait based off Henri Rousseau's work. Henri Rousseau work included a lot of nature, can you create a self portrait of yourself out of things you can find in nature. E.g a stick for facial features, leaves for hair, grass for eyebrows.
<u>Timetables</u> Practice 2s, 5s and 10 timetables. This can be done by simply writing them out, using timetables songs on YouTube or even a practical activity (find 2 socks, find 5 pieces of pasta etc)	<u>RE - What is the good news?</u> Think about: something you have achieved, or something exciting, a surprise you have received or some good news you shared or received. Draw a picture of your good news and write 2-3 sentences explaining it. What was the good news? How did it make you feel? Who did you share it with?	<u>Respect - Kindness</u> Our school value this term is 'respect'. Showing kindness to people is being respectful. Think about some random acts of kindness you can do for people you know. It could be making someone a card, helping clean up with being asked to, baking a cake for your neighbour etc.
